# Reminders: Child Safeguarding

The school plays an important role in Child Protection/Safeguarding and all staff members are trained in this responsibility. Should you have any concern please note that the Designated Liaison Person (DLP) is Nóra Lynch and the Deputy Designated Liaison Person (DDLP) is Grace Conneally.

# Late Arrivals/Early Collections

For health and safety reasons, should a pupil need to leave the school during the day for any reason, e.g. medical appointments, dental appointments or should a pupil arrive late to school, this needs to be recorded on Aladdin. We ask that parents inform us one day in advance of any early collection via the Aladdin Connect app. Pupils leaving early will be brought to the <u>main gate</u> where they will need to be signed out. All pupils arriving after 9.00am must be signed in by an adult. **We ask that children are only taken out of school early if absolutely necessary**. We appreciate your cooperation with this matter.

## Morning Supervision

Our school starts at 9.00am. The school provides supervision from 8.50am-9.00am, where the pupils can make their way to their classrooms. <u>Pupils must not be on the</u> <u>school grounds prior to 8.50am</u>.

## Communication with teachers

Staff members can be contacted by making an appointment through the school office only. Please email <u>secretary@ticknevinns.ie</u> if you wish to make an appointment to speak to your child's teacher. If you need to contact the school during the day the most effective method is by emailing the office. We do not have full time office hours; therefore, please email any messages to the school office. The drop off and collection time is very busy and staff are needed for supervision to ensure the safety of the children so please try not to use this time to deliver messages or ask questions.

## **Parent Teacher Meetings**

Parent Teacher Meetings for all classes will take place face-to-face/by phone during the week of **November 20<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th.</sup>** Parents will book their chosen time-slots for their PT meetings via the Aladdin Connect app. The booking system will open on the week of Monday, 6<sup>th</sup> November.

It is very important to communicate with your child's teacher and discuss their progress. Please ensure you arrive promptly at your appointment time. Meetings will be **10 minutes** in duration and we ask that parents knock on the classroom door at their appointment time for face-to-face meetings. Please be mindful not to delay, parents will be waiting as meeting times are scheduled back to back. If you require a longer meeting, an alternative meeting will have to be arranged at a later date. This will ensure that any concern can be discussed properly and without encroaching on another parent's allocated time.
